AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING REQUIREMENTS AND STANDARDS FOR THE USE OF TEMPORARY ELECTRIC METER LOOPS; REQUIRING THE FINAL INSPECTION OF A SEPTIC SYSTEM PRIOR TO CONVERSION TO A PERMANENT ELECTRIC METER LOOP; PROVIDING FOR THE DISCONNECTION OF THE TEMPORARY METER LOOP IF A BUILDING IS OCCUPIED PRIOR TO THE SEPTIC SYSTEM APPROVAL; AND PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF UHLAND, TEXAS:

Section 1. This ordinance shall be construed in conjunction with Ordinance No. 16.

Section 2. In cases where a person has obtained a temporary meter loop for electrical service to allow construction of a building, but has not obtained approval of a septic system for the use of such building, he must obtain such approval of the septic system prior to the installation of the permanent meter loop for permanent electrical service.

Section 3. No person shall occupy a building for residential or business purposes unless the septic system has been approved as required herein.

Section 4. If a building has been occupied for residential or business purposes, and is served with a temporary loop for electric service, but has not received a certificate of approval of its septic system, the Electric Utility serving such property shall, on request of the City of Uhland, Texas, acting through its authorized officials, disconnect such electric service. The service shall not be connected again until the approval of the septic system has been secured.

Section 5. Anyone who occupies a building for residential or business purposes without an approved septic system commits a misdemeanor; each day or a part thereof shall constitute a separate offense; each offense shall be punished by a fine not to exceed two hundred dollars upon final conviction in the municipal court of the City of Uhland.
