ORDINANCE NO. 26

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING OWNERS OF DOGS FROM ALLOWING THEM TO RUN AT LARGE; PROVIDING FOR IMPOUNDING SUCH DOGS; AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF UHLAND, TEXAS:

Section 1. The Council hereby finds that this Ordinance is necessary to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Uhland.

Section 2. Owners of dogs shall not permit such animals to run at large within the city limits. To run at large means: to be on the property of one who is not the owner of such dog, or on public property, and to be unrestrained by leash or immediate voice control.

Section 3. Any person may request the impoundment of a dog running at large. Such request shall be directed to such governmental agency empowered to impound such dog, and any fees required shall be paid by the person making the request.

Section 4. Any owner of a dog that permits it to run at large commits an offense, and upon conviction for such offense shall be fined not less than one dollar and not more than two hundred dollars. Each time that a dog is permitted to run at large is a separate offense.

This ordinance is effective immediately.
